







INSTALLING THE EXHIBITION

The travelling exhibition will arrive like this:

- 5 double-sided pull-up banners each inside a labelled canvas zip up bag
- 3 wooden crates protected by bubble wrap

Each crate contains A-frame, with a framed set of replica medals on either side, plus an A4 laminated citation for each man.

Each bag is labelled with a number and panel name so you can work out the display order:

- 1. Intro Title / The story of the Victoria Cross
- 2. The story of the George Cross / South Australia and the Second World War
- 3. Kibby/Derrick
- 4. Gosse/Matthews
- 5. Badcoe/South Australia and the Vietnam War

Dimensions (mm)

Banner: H 2000 x W 850 x D 450

(in bag: H 90 x W 950 x D 250)

Crate: H 650 x W 600 x D 300

Frame: H 600

Setting up banners

- Take out base and folded rod (inside long pocket) from bag
- Put the rod together and place one end in the socket in centre of base on the ground
- Carefully pull up one banner and clip top end of rod into place so it is secure (you may need to tip the base towards you as you are pulling up the banner)
- Pull up the second banner on the other side and clip top end of rod into place (again it may be easier to tip the base towards you as you are pulling up banner)
- Do the same for all 5 double-sided banners

To decrease risk of damage, it's a good idea to place the banners in their bags where you intend setting them up rather than moving them after they have been set up





Setting up framed medals

- Unwrap bubble wrap carefully (save as much as possible for packing for return trip)
- Pull down the hinged side and slide out the shiny black lid of the crate
- Carefully pull out the hinged A-frame (it might be stiff as it fits snugly
 inside the crate, protected by the foam rubber inner lining) and set up
 on top of the black lid. Place laminated citations under frame on top of
 lid.

NB when replacing the black lid you may need to give the hinged section a slight thump with the side of your hand to ensure it closes tight.
