

Each banner bag is numbered so you can work out the order that they need to be displayed.

- 1. South Australians on the Eve of War
- 2. Mobilisation on the Home Front
- 3. Men and the Home Front
- 4. Continuing Work after Troops came Home
- 5. Stories and Profiles





Setting up our exhibition The Great War at Home is simple





... and clip top end of rod into place (it may be easier to tip base towards you as you are pulling up banner). We suggest that you display the banners so that visitors are encouraged to read them in the order above, although the content of each banner is self-contained. However, the first banner has the title of the exhibition so should be the first one visitors see when they arrive at the exhibition space.

To decrease risk of damage, it's a good idea to place the banners in their bags where you intend setting them up rather than moving them after they have been set up.

Reverse the process when taking the exhibition down. Ensure you replace the banners in their correct numbered bags.

The banners are sturdy but beware of placing in a area where open doors or windows cause a wind tunnel. The banners will blow down and fall like dominoes.
